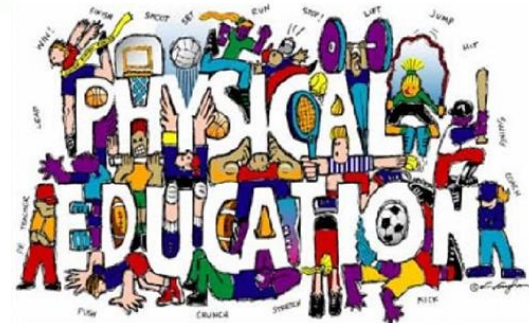
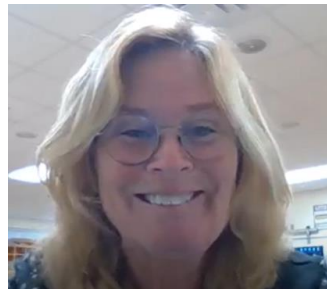

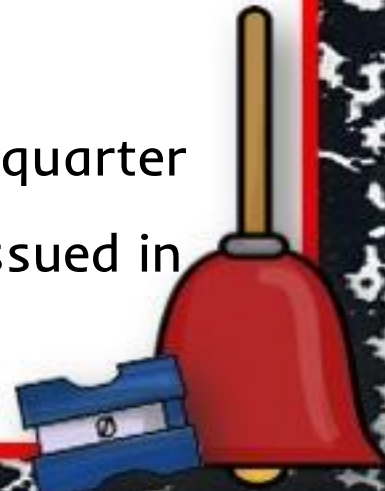

Skyward

- Please complete all online consent forms.
- Students will not be able to use computers or iPads, or receive care from the clinic, if the digital consent forms are not complete.
- Grades will be posted by Thursday evening each week.
- Report Cards will be issued at the end of each quarter (every 9 weeks), with Progress Reports being issued in the middle of each quarter.



Attendance

- The first bell rings at 8:40. The late bell rings at 8:45.
- Tardies and early dismissals are disruptive to the learning environment.
- When a child is tardy or leaves early, 2 other children must escort that child to the office.
- I understand that appointments can be necessary during the school day. Please email me in advance.





Arrival and Dismissal

- Students may not arrive to school before 8:15 unless they are enrolled in extended day.
- The late bell rings at 8:45am each day.
- Dismissal on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday is 3:00pm. No early release after 2:30.
- Dismissal on Wednesday is 2:00. No early release after 1:30pm.



Grading

- Classwork, homework, computer based tests/assessments, teacher observations, and more will determine student grades.
- Not all grades (computer based tests, teacher observation, etc.) will be posted to Skyward.
- A student may receive S's on classwork due to collaborative nature of the class but still receive a W on their Progress Report or Report Card.

Clinic/Nurses Office

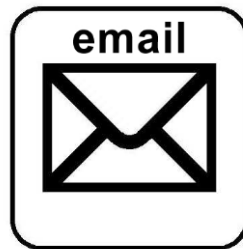
- The nurse's office is for first aid only. Sick or injured students must be sent home. (complete the opt in form online to allow your child to receive care from the clinic)

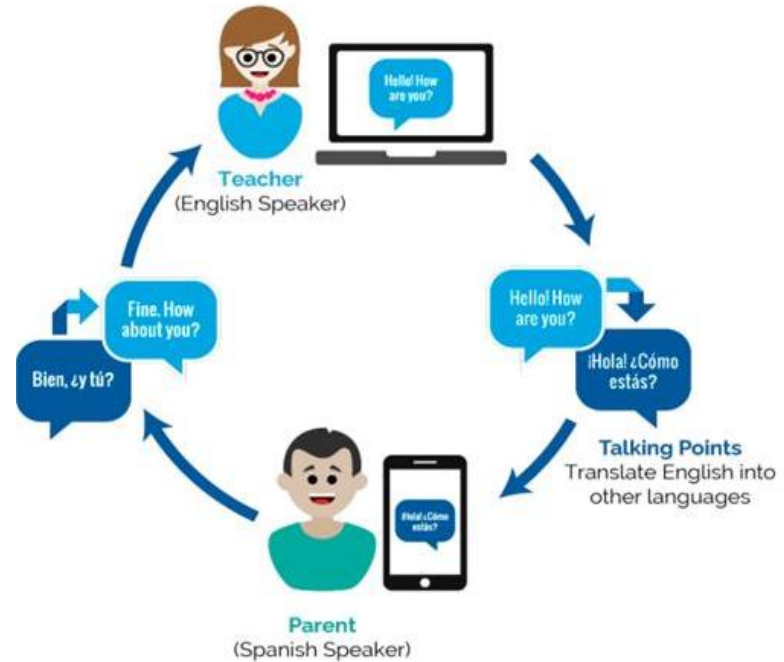
Using Talking Points to Communicate with Families

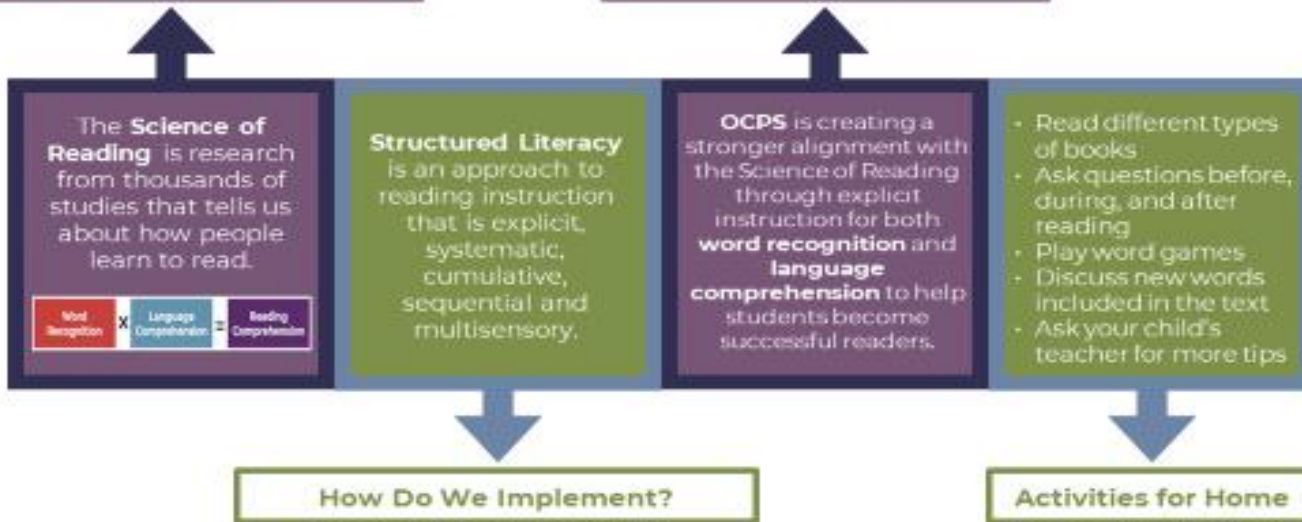

The Science of Reading

What is the Science of Reading?

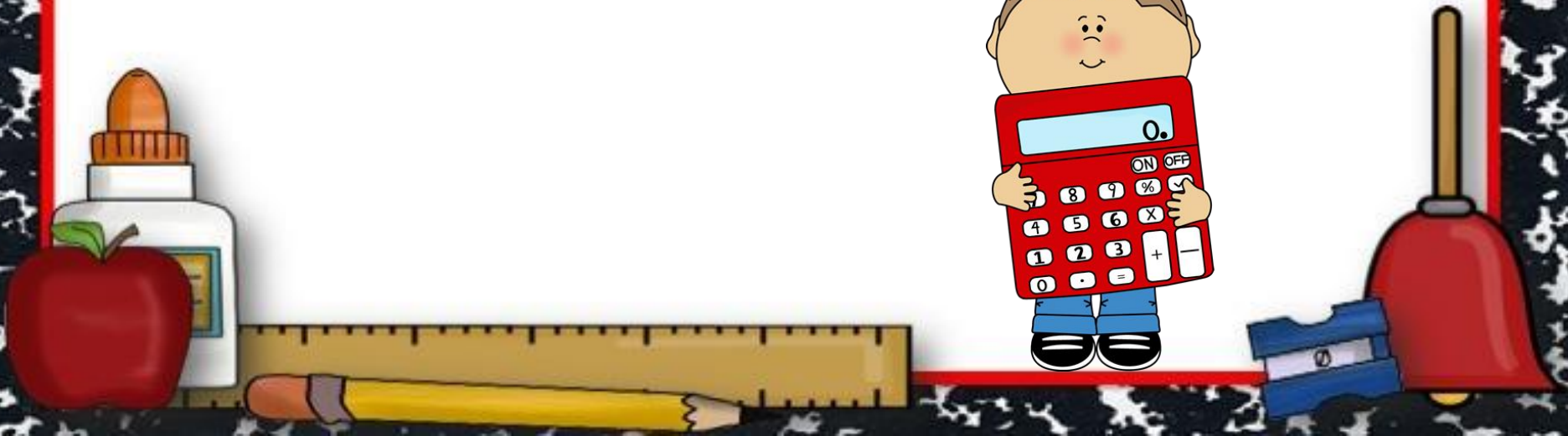
Language Arts

- Reading is taught based on the BEST Standards.
- It is vital that students spend 20 minutes reading at home each night to practice and reinforce reading skills.
- Writing is a huge component in first grade. Students will be able to write Informative (Explanatory), Narrative, and Opinion writing in response to a text.



Math

- Math is taught based on the BEST Standards.
- We will study geometry, measurement, data, algebra and algebraic thinking and operations.



Science

- Students will be using Inspire Science, a science series based on Florida's Sunshine State Standards.
- We will incorporate hands on experiments throughout the year.



Social Studies

- Students will deepen their understanding of historical content, promote empathy, strengthen analytical skills, in preparation to become active participants in civic life.
- Some topics include rules, responsibilities, community, citizenship, fairness, kindness, maps, timelines, people and events, goods and services, and money.



Health

- Students will explore a variety of topics about their physical, mental, social, and emotional well being.
- Some topics include healthy behaviors, positive choices, needs and wants, listening skills, wanted and unwanted situations, preventing illness and injuries, consequences, and warning labels.



Lunch/Snack and Recess

- Students have 25 minutes for lunch each day.
- Students have 20 minutes of recess each day.
- Recess may be at the playground, in the classroom, or elsewhere around campus depending on the weather, student testing or other factors.
- Students eat snack each day. It is a short, working snack as this is also our Math time. Please send easy snacks and include any necessary utensils!



Classwork / Unit Assessments

- We do a lot of centers and hands on activities in class. There may not be an abundance of worksheets or workbook papers coming home due to the hands on nature of some activities.
- Per the district, we will be using a post test for most units to monitor progress and specific student needs. Please use these tests to help work with your child at home.
 - I will monitor each student throughout each unit to determine the progress being made so I can better see what students need to focus on more. Post tests will be given at the end of each unit to show what each student has mastered.



Homework

- Homework will be sent home weekly and will be based on all Language Arts and Math Standards.
- Homework will be due each week.
- The goal is not perfection on homework, it is for students to practice skills!
- Parents may not do homework or special projects for students! Please support your child, but allow him or her to complete the work.



Class Discipline

- Good behavior is essential to the learning environment!
- To encourage good behavior, I will provide incentives such as treats, special privileges, positive phone calls/notes etc...



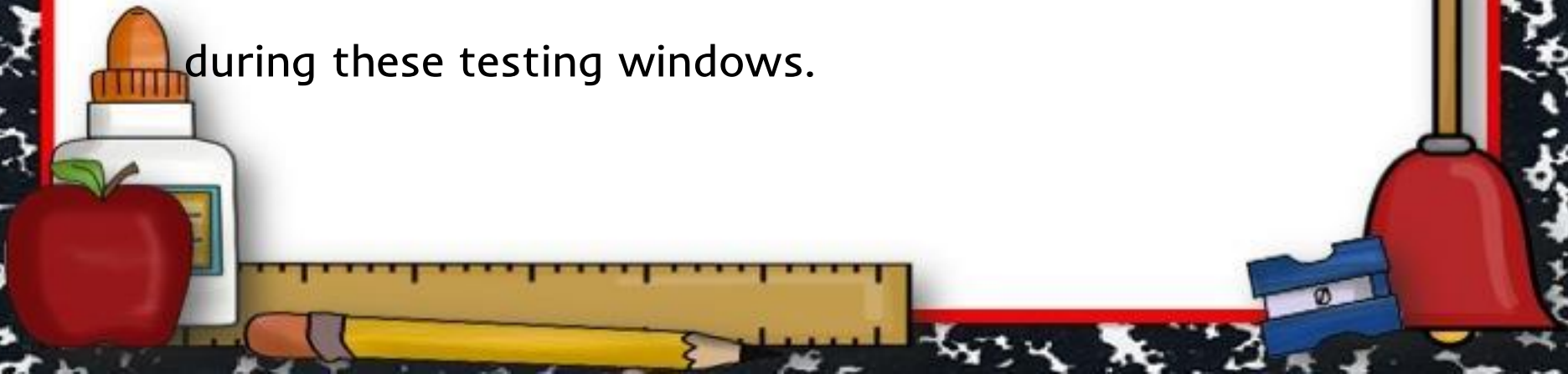
1st Grade Testing

- First graders will use digital programs to support their academic needs this year. Students will use Exact Path in reading and Success Maker in math. Reports for both programs will be shared throughout the school year to keep you informed of your child's progress.
- First graders will be tested on their independent reading level two times a year based on approved OCPS benchmark assessments such as SIPPS, Heggerty, and Fountas and Pinnell, and DIBELS. Testing will be done in the fall and spring.



School Wide Testing

- All students will be taking FAST assessments in Reading and Math three times during the school year (fall, winter, and spring).
- Parents are generally not able to visit at lunch time during these testing windows.



OCPS Cell Phone Policy Update

Hunter's Creek Elementary is following the OCPS Cell Phone Policy as listed below.

OCPS requires that wireless communications device(s)* be silenced and put away (in a backpack or purse) during the school day while on campus, including lunchtime and transitioning between classes.

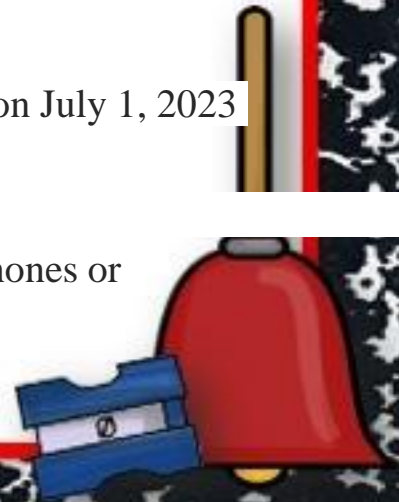
**Wireless communication devices include but are not limited to, cell phones and/or auxiliary/ancillary devices such as watches and ear buds.*

The following actions will be taken if a student violates OCPS' cell phone policy:

- Confiscation (Item returned at the end of the day)
- Detention
- Positive Alternative to School Suspension (PASS)
- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)

Pursuant to the Technology in K-12 Public Schools law that took effect on July 1, 2023 and Section 1006.07, Florida Statutes.

At no time shall OCPS be responsible for theft, loss or damage of cell phones or other electronic devices brought onto district property.



Field Trips

- Parents interested in chaperoning field trips should complete the online application as soon as possible.
- The field trip coordinator will set the number of chaperones based on availability and space.
- Chaperones will be chosen at random to assure fairness.
- Chaperones must be at least 21 and siblings may not attend.
- Chaperones must also be willing to supervise multiple children at a time.
- Payments for field trips will be made on SchoolPay.

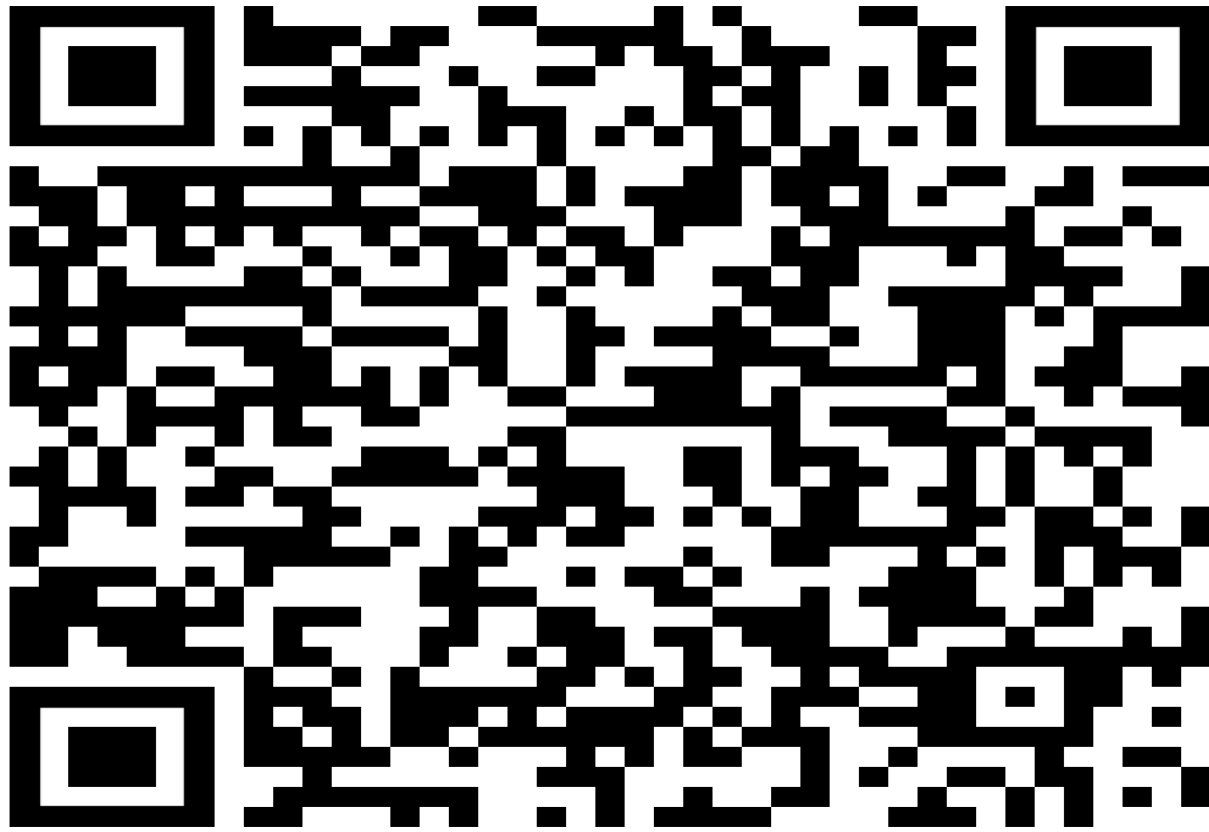
