



School Hours

Students may not arrive to school before 8:15 unless they are enrolled in extended day.

The late bell rings at 8:45am each day. Students must be in class before that bell rings or they are considered tardy.

Dismissal on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday is 3:00pm. No early release after 2:30.

Dismissal on Wednesday is 2:00. No early release after 1:30pm.



In severe weather dismissal, we will revert t a single car line.

Please bring your car ride number tag to the cafeteria to get your child If your child is a walker/biker, you will check him/her out in the front office (front walker) or back of school (back walker).





Afternoon Car Pool Process:

- · All cars enter off of Town Center Blvd and follow the normal route.
- · When you get to the last turn, K-2 students stay to the right and 3-5 stay left.
- · Twenty vehicles will stage in the yellow box.
- · All twenty vehicles will load and when all are filled, staff will release traffic.
- · Vehicles staged to the right (K-2) will exit to the bus loop and turn right onto Town Center Blvd.
- Vehicles staged to the left (3-5) will exit the normal route and turn right onto Town Center Blvd.
- · This process will continue until dismissal is over.

Clinic/Nurses Office

- The nurse's office is for first aid only. Sick or injured students
 must be sent home. (complete the opt in form online to allow
 your child to receive care from the clinic)
- Medication must be given to the nurse in the clinic. Students may not carry medication (including lozenges) in their backpack.
- Parents may administer medication to their children only in the clinic.

OCPS Cell Phone Policy

Hunter's Creek Elementary is following the OCPS Cell Phone Policy as listed below.

OCPS requires that wireless communications device(s)* be silenced and put away (in a backpack or purse) during the school day while on campus, including lunchtime and transitioning between classes.

*Wireless communication devices include but are not limited to, cell phones and/or auxiliary/ancillary devices such as watches and ear buds.

The following actions will be taken if a student violates OCPS' cell phone policy:

- Confiscation (Item returned at the end of the day)
- Detention
- Positive Alternative to School Suspension (PASS)
- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)






Third Grade Curriculum


