Curriculum

ELA/SLA

We use the Wonders reading program that provides students with both independent and collaborative learning opportunities.

During the reading block students are provided both whole group and small group instruction to ensure that all students are successful.

MATH

We are using Envision Math with a Saavas integration component. The program provides access to all levels or learners with interactive videos and digital math tools!

It is very important that students practice their multiplication and division facts daily.

We are also pleased to be using Successmaker. This is a personalized learning program system for continuously adaptive intervention and differentiation. This programs supplements the daily core mathematics instruction.

Curriculum-Science

- -Science includes many hands on inquiries as well as class demonstrations. This helps students understand the scientific concepts that are taking place.
- -Science involves a lot of vocabulary. We encourage you to practice this at home!

Curriculum-Social Studies and Health

- -We embed historical texts during ELA and Reading intervention.
- -The purpose of this course is to provide students with the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills necessary to make healthy choices with the overall goal of improving quality of life, as well as describe the relationships between a healthy behavior, environment and personal health.

Homework

- Students will write their homework assignments in their agendas, so please check it daily.
- Recurring homework assignments that they will have for Sra. Cabán are Istation and Study Island.
 - Istation requires 45 minutes a week unless told otherwise.
 - Study Island requires a score of 80% or higher on the practice questions.
 - For Ms.Hahn, Math homework will usually be given Monday-Thursday. Students are encouraged to use XtraMath at home, for Multiplication and Division. Independent reading of 20 minutes per night.

Grading Policies

How bridging is accomplished at HCES? ¿Cómo se logra el bridging en HCES?

- It is student-centered
- Students are guided to communicate what they have learned in the other language.
- There is contrastive analysis, during which the students identify structural similarities and differences between the languages.
- A bridge occurs at the end of a unit in Science,
 Social Studies and Math.
- Students understand that what they learned in one language can be applied to the other.



How can I support my child's success in the TWDC program? ¿Cómo puedo apoyar el éxito de mi hijo en el programa dual?



•Study with your child at least 30 minutes per night (even if there is no homework) Estudie con su hijo al menos 30 minutos por noche (incluso si no hay tarea



Suggested activities:

•Label common household items and or practice the Language of the Day to the extent possible. Etiquete los artículos comunes del hogar y o practique el Idioma del día en la medida que sea posible.



•Watch with your child, cartoons or appropriate programs on TV that are broadcasted in the second language. Watching movies that they know in their first language with audios in the second language might be beneficial for the second language development. ∀ea con su hijo, dibujos animados o programas apropiados en la televisión que se transmiten en el segundo idioma. Ver películas que conocen en su primer idioma con audios en el segundo idioma podría ser beneficioso para el desarrollo del segundo idioma.

•Play games with your child in which they must use their second language. Juegue juegos con su hijo en los que debe usar su segundo idioma.

During your commute from home to school and vice versa, listen to music in the second language. Listen to audiobooks in the second language from the public library, the school library or the electronic resources the school offers for you. Escuche audiolibros en el segundo idioma de la biblioteca pública, la biblioteca escolar o los recursos electrónicos que la escuela le ofrece.



Collaborate as an audience for your child when practicing speaking, reading aloud, writing or dramatizing in the second language. Colabore como una audiencia para su hijo cuando practique hablar, leer en voz alta, escribir o dramatizar en el segundo idioma.
