



Sawgrass has been sharing his knowledge of the Southeastern Native American tribes for over 25 years. He served on the Florida Indian Council from 1991-1995.



The Science of Reading is research from thousands of studies that tells us about how people learn to read.



Structured Literacy

is an approach to reading instruction that is explicit, systematic, cumulative, sequential and multisensory. OCPS is creating a stronger alignment with the Science of Reading through explicit instruction for both word recognition and language comprehension to help students become

successful readers.

- Read different types of books
- Ask questions before, during, and after reading
- Play word games
- Discuss new words included in the text
- Ask your child's teacher for more tips

# Cell Phone Policy



Effect July 1, 2023, <u>section 1006.07(2)(f)</u>, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, now provides that "a student may not use a wireless communications device during instructional time.

The 2023-2024 Code of Student Conduct requires that wireless communications device(s)\* be silenced and put away (in a backpack or purse) during the school day while on campus, including lunchtime and transitioning between classes.

\*Wireless communication devices include but are not limited to, cell \_\_\_\_\_\_phones and/or auxiliary/ancillary devices such as watches and ear buds.

# Cell Phone Policy Continued

The following actions will be taken if a student violates OCPS' cell phone policy:

- Confiscation (Item returned at the end of the day)
- Detention
- Positive Alternative to School Suspension (PASS)
- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)
