Supplemental Curriculum to Promote Language and Literacy Foundations

- "The Purple Book," as it's often called", uses nursery rhymes to introduce preschool students to language play. The lessons include eight phonological and phonemic awareness skills.
- Through early literacy skills, students develop alphabet knowledge through daily practice with an alphabet song and letter name and sound practice. Nursery rhymes are taught each week so that by the end of preschool your students will begin to build a repertoire of classic nursery rhymes as they learn to enjoy language play!
